Workgroup Information: Religions and Work

Description

A set of interreligious seminars on Decent Work are currently being organized in the framework of a partnership between the World Council of Churches, the ISESCO and the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace. The working group aims to facilitate exchange among participants in the meeting. Contributions from participants, supporting documents and relevant materials will be shared in this forum.

Goals

Through the Interreligious Seminar on Decent Work to take place on 27-29 April the goals include:

- Identifying possible convergences between religious traditions and the Decent Work agenda on the following topics:
 - The meaning of work in each religious tradition
 - Rights based approach and ethics concerning work in each religious tradition
 - Commitments being made by each religious tradition
- Preparing a follow-up for this reflection. We will focus on some issues central to ILO work and part of the Decent work agenda in the following areas:
 - Youth employment
 - Child labour
 - Labour standard and human dignity
 - Social protection

Working Methods

The meeting will include presentations from experts from a diversity of religious traditions as well as specialists from the International Labour Organization. There will be an opportunity for interventions and comments. This will be followed by a general debate.

This web based platform through Globethics.net will allow us to pursue share in the discussion during and following the meeting. We will share our documents on "Religion and work" and invite other experts to join us in an additional open working group.

Expected outcome and impact

This meeting has been preceded by a meeting in Dakar in December 2009 and will be followed by others as part of wider project on Religion and Work.

These efforts will facilitate the first elements of converging ideas that could be highlighted in a brochure or more substantially documented in a larger publication.

Participants and Access Policy

Participation in this working group is restricted to participants in interreligious dialogue project on decent work. The *Working Group 1*. 6 will be the designated 'open working group. Participants in the meaning are encouraged to join both.

Timeframe

The Interreligious Seminar on Decent Work will take place on 27-29 April 2011. It will be followed by another meeting most likely end of May 2011. While the discussion is ongoing, the time frame for the project is one year.

Milestones

Milestones include the Interreligious Seminar on Decent Work held in Dakar, Senegal December 2009 which was the basis for this next series of meetings.
